

Congratulations also to Con Guerriero our most recent Club Life Member with thanks for the many years of dedicated service you have given the Club.

To all our trophy winners — I know how much you deserve them and none more so than Des Aldridge winner of the prestigious "Indian of the Year" award as our most outstanding Club person.

Thank you too, to all the Coaches, Managers Scorers and other back up staff that helped field 10 teams every week.

On the Social side Jenny Braddock's tireless efforts cannot go unmentioned, as she co-ordinated an excellent programme. Other functions are planned off season and I urge all members to support them wherever possible. Jenny was assisted by a compact dynamic committee and our gratitude is extended to them as well.

Financially the good work of our social group was again supported magnificently by the efforts of "Mr. Goodwood" Phil White who through his Supporters Club and other means

once more raised very valuable funds. Apart from her work as Treasurer Pat Wood again contributed great efforts in other areas of the Club and to her again we record our heartfelt gratitude.

This season saw the introduction of the National Baseball League. The Goodwood Baseball Club is a shareholder in Stateball, supports the concept and encourages it's Members to support Giant's fixtures when possible. #### "TREASURER'S REPORT 1989/90

The following Financial Statements have been prepared to be included in this report, however they are still subject to audit. If, after being audited, any discrepancies are found, an amended Financial Report will be distributed to Members.

The season finished with an outstanding debt of \$500 owing to P.White for an Interest Free Loan. This result, while not being good, is acceptable as halfway through the season it was estimated (taking into account previous fundraising functions) that there could be a deficit of \$3000, however due to the tireless effort of the Social Convenor, Mrs Jenny Braddock and her small band of helpers, they were able to reduce this deficit.

The End of Season Ball raised \$1072, Sunday BBQs also were successful raising \$1090.00. The raffles raised a total of \$5134.00, the first raffle being the most successful raising a total of \$3165.00. John Bushell and his helpers raised \$805 from a very successful Seafood Night and Glen Clements raised \$635 from empty bottle and can deposits.

Once again thanks must also go to Phil White for his outstanding efforts in raising \$7031.00 through Lucky Tickets, Bingo and Supporters Club. Phil raised \$3000 of this amount by selling Bingo Tickets (with the aid of helpers) at the Westlakes Shopping Centre.

The Kitchen and Canteen were again profitable this season. The Kitchen being managed by Mrs Jill Baker and strongly supported by the Little Indians PeeWee Baseball League.

2 Annual Repayments of \$773.04 each remain to be paid off the Backstop Loan from the Mitcham Council.

In the coming season I will have to recommend that fees be increased to cover extra costs, one being the increase in Colonel Light Gardens Community Association Membership to our Members.
On closing the Club will need the full support of all Members to reach the Fundraising Target of an estimated \$18,000.00.
